
At the back of this book you'll find a link to a Spotify playlist called "Whatever Is Lovely" to help

Of course, worship is often best shared with others. Why not get a group of friends together and have a coloring night? Gather around a table and share your lives and your stories while sharing your colored pencils.



Amazing grace! How sweet the sound That saved a wretch like me! I once was lost, but now am found; Was blind, but now I see.


'Twas grace that taught my heart to fear, And grace my fears relieved. How precious did that grace appear The hour I first believed.

John Newton first went to sea at age eleven with his widowed father. He later was pressed into service on a British Navy man-of-war vessel and ultimately deserted because the conditions on board were unbearable. He became involved in the slave trade, and while navigating a terrible storm in 1748, Newton cried out to God to save him, and the ship was brought safely through the storm. He considered that the moment of his conversion and was inspired to write "Amazing Grace" about it many years after he left the sea.
