- 9. How are the principles of Jesus' life, and the success many people find from implementing them, different from a prosperity gospel, get-rich-quick promise?
- 10. In your book, you write about the great worth of the individual, specifically how much each person is worth to God and how that is unchanging. You also talk about His desire that we be purpose-accomplished, not just purpose-driven. Tell us about the interplay of grace and works and about how they should impact our ongoing motivation?
