

She brings that detailed understanding and cultural respect to her latest book, *A Love Undone* (WaterBrook Press, 9/9/14).

Woodsmall explores the fascinating rules governing marriage, divorce, and remarriage among the Plain People. As a young woman, Jolene Keim was on the brink of happily-ever-after when a family tragedy stole her future and burdened her with

an unbearable decision. For the last ten years she has sacrificed her dreams for the sake of family life.

Then she meets Andy Fisher (a minor character from the Christmas novella *The Dawn of Christmas*), a horse trainer and father to a sweet nine-year old, Tobias. A grass widower, Fisher's wife left him six years ago, though he is unable to divorce or remarry, according to the Amish ways.

Though both Andy and Jolene had made their peace with the solitary future they faced, their deepening friendship forces them to wrestle with some difficult choices. Will they find strength to maintain the proper distance . . . and will their trust in God's guidance to help them find their way to a happy ending?
