




DIY FLUFFY

Host your slime-making party this Valentine's Day with a slime recipe you can make at home! This activity is sure to bring hours of fun and play! Suitable for ages 4 and above.

What you'll need (makes about 32 oz)

3 cups foam shaving cream

½ cup washable white PVA school glue

I - 1 ½ tablespoons saline solution containing boric acid and sodium borate

½ cup water

½ teaspoon baking soda

Liquid food coloring of your choice Large mixing bowl and spatula

MONSTERS AND PEOPLE DON'T EAT SLIME! ADULT SUPERVISION IS RECOMMENDED.

Try making colored batches of fluffy slime and mix them! Or introduce heart and monster-shaped cookie cutters for more sensory fun!







Directions

- Combine the foam shaving cream and begin with 2-3 drops of food coloring in a large mixing bowl. Mix slowly with a spatula to keep the mixture fluffy. Continue adding food coloring until you are satisfied with the color.
- Pour in the water and glue. Mix again.
- Add baking soda, which helps thicken the slime. Begin with 1/4 teaspoon, mix, and continue to add the rest as you stir the mixture.
- Stir in a tablespoon of saline solution to activate your slime.
- Add a few drops of the remaining saline solution to clean hands (this prevents the slime from sticking) and gently knead the mixture. The slime will begin forming when it pulls away from the bowl.
 - You may need more activators depending on the brand of saline solution you use. The more saline solution you add, the stiffer your slime will be.
 - 🚄 It is common for slime to be stringy and sticky as you begin kneading it. Continue kneading and stretching slowly until the slime consistency changes.
 - If the slime consistency does not change after kneading, rest in a clean container for a few minutes.
 - Always store your slime in a clean, covered container!



Consider wearing gloves while making slime. Remember to wash your hands before and after the activity!

DIY GLITTER VALENTINES

Are you looking for DIY gifts? Try this scented Snoodle-themed glitter slime recipe! You can bottle them in little jars personalized with printable Snoodle labels to hand out as valentines! This activity is suitable for ages 4 and above.

What you'll need (makes about 8 oz)

I tablespoon green or red flavored Jello gelatin powder

I - 2 tablespoons saline solution containing boric acid and sodium borate

½ cup clear washable PVA school glue

½ teaspoon baking soda

½ cup water


Glitter or confetti

Large mixing bowl and spoon

Small condiment sized jars or containers

REMEMBER, SLIME IS NOT EDIBLE! ADULT SUPERVISION IS RECOMMENDED.

Making slime can be messyl Keep long hair tied up and wear an apron. White vinegar can help remove slime from clothes.





Directions

- Combine the water, glue, and gelatin powder in a large mixing bowl and mix well with a spoon.
- Stir in the glitter or confetti and mix again.
- Add baking soda, which helps thicken the slime. Begin with 1/4 teaspoon, mix, and continue to add more as you stir the mixture.
- 🛮 Pour in a tablespoon of saline solution to activate your slime. Stir to combine. The slime will begin forming when it pulls away from the bowl.
- Add a few drops of the remaining saline solution to clean hands (this prevents the slime from sticking) and gently knead the mixture. You will notice the slime forming as it pulls away from the sides of the bowl.
 - You may need more activators depending on the brand of saline solution you use. The more saline solution you add, the stiffer your slime will be.
 - Slime can be stringy and sticky when you begin kneading it. Continue kneading and stretching slowly until the slime consistency changes. You may also set it aside to rest in a clean container for a few minutes.
 - 🤎 When the slime is ready, portion it out into small containers. Stick a Snoodle label on each jar (see printable on the next page), and your valentines are ready!



Consider wearing gloves while making slime. Remember to wash your hands before and after the activity!


GIFT TAGS


Add a monstery touch of love with DIY gift tags featuring Snoodle and her monster friends from the book!


what's Love Anyway?
