The Minor Miracle is the first book in The Amazing Adventures of Noah Minor, a middle-grade adventure series featuring a superhero meets secret agent mash-up in a modern-day school setting. The story is filled with superpowers, the CIA, the Macy's Day Parade, and a touch of humor, science, mystery, and more!

Themes: Superheroes and Spies, Friendship, Adventure, Family and Relationships, Self-Esteem, Making Choices

ABOUT THE AUTHOR

Meredith Davis is a wife, mother, and grandmother living in Austin, Texas. She is the founder of the Austin chapter of the Society of Children's Books Writers and Illustrators and holds an MFA in writing for children and young adults from the Vermont College of Fine Arts. Her first book, Her Own Two Feet, which she co-authored with Rebeka Uwitonze, earned a starred review in Publishers Weekly, was a Junior Library Guild selection, a nominee for the NAACP Image Award, and World Magazine's Children's Book of the Year for nonfiction.





- The Minor Miracle references a comic book quote, "With great power there must also come—great responsibility."
 Do you agree or disagree with this statement? What real-world examples show how power and responsibility go hand in hand?
- In response to Noah's unusual power, which he calls 'The Cling,' Uncle Saul encourages Noah in Chapter 3, saying, "The things that make you different, even make you suffer, can be your greatest strengths." What makes you different? Has it made things hard for you? How has it been good for you?
- Noah took longer than expected to progress in his gravitar training. In Chapter 7, his good friend Haley encouraged him to "be patient and trust the process." Think of a time when you had to learn something new. What was it like? What did you like or dislike about the process?
- Rodney's favorite musician is Dizzy Gillespie, an American jazz trumpeter.
 Who is someone famous or important that you look up to? Why?
- What are some ways you relate to the Gravitas trainees in the book—Noah, Haley, Dawson, Olivia, or Phillip?

- Noah and his friend Rodney named Chuck Gallusky, their eighth-grade school bully, 'The Tormentor.' Do you consider bullying a severe problem in your community? Why or why not?
- Bullying is unkind and unacceptable.
 Have you been bullied or tried to help someone who is bullied? What happened?
- The Minor Miracle includes strong themes of friendship and loyalty.
 Friendships can be challenging and complicated. How does the book illustrate these ideas?
- Noah broke Gravitas' rules by using his powers on Chuck at school. Evaluate Noah's actions. How else could Noah have defended his friends?
- Friends like Haley and Rodney supported Noah and stood by him through good and bad times. What are some of the ways you can be a good friend to others?
- The book describes Gravitas as an organization that protects and defends all that is true, good, and beautiful.
 What are some things that are 'true, good, and beautiful' to you? How can you protect and defend them?




DESIGN YOUR ALIGNMENT MEDAL


