## HBOUT THE BOOK


Noah Minor is back for another action-packed adventure—this time in the Big Apple—where he's hoping to stop Gravitas' most wanted (and Noah's great uncle) once and for all!

When twenty-six middle schoolers are kidnapped, Gravitas sends Noah to New York City to look for clues to Uncle Saul's location. Noah hopes to make things right and prove he isn't an epic failure. The Minor Rescue is the second book in The Amazing Adventures of Noah Minor, a middle-grade adventure series featuring a superhero meets secret agent mash-up in a modern-day school setting.

**Themes:** Superheroes and Spies, Friendship, Adventure, Family and Relationships, Self-Esteem, Making Choices, Loyalty

## ABOUT THE AUTHOR

Meredith Davis is a wife, mother, and grandmother living in Austin, Texas. She is the founder of the Austin chapter of the Society of Children's Books Writers and Illustrators and holds an MFA in writing for children and young adults from the Vermont College of Fine Arts. Her first book, Her Own Two Feet, which she co-authored with Rebeka Uwitonze, earned a starred review in Publishers Weekly, was a Junior Library Guild selection, a nominee for the NAACP Image Award, and World Magazine's Children's Book of the Year for nonfiction.





- In The Minor Rescue, Noah and a few Gravitas trainees are sent to New York City to seek clues about Uncle Saul's possible location. This special mission leads Noah and his friends to places like the Empire State Building, Grand Central Station, Bannerman Island, the Frick Collection, and more. Have you ever traveled to another city? How did you spend your time?
- Consider the Gravitas trainees in the book—Noah, Haley, Dawson, Olivia, and Chuck. Use a word or a phrase to describe each of them. Do they remind you of people you know?
- Fictional characters inspire both Noah and Dawson. Noah channels the Hulk while Dawson admires the boxer Rocky. What is a character from a movie, TV show, or book who inspires you? What traits do they have that you try to copy and channel?
- Chapter 2 describes how Haley spends her time after school and gravitar training to make flyers and organize a rally to save the playground in her neighborhood park from being demolished. Have you ever felt so passionate about something that it inspired you to take action? What happened?

- Grandmother Minor tells Noah and Haley in Chapter 7, "Nothing is impossible... anything is possible with hard work, determination, and the right connections." Do you agree or disagree with her statement? Why?
- Noah engages in unsavory name-calling in the book—the use of insulting names and expressions to describe someone like "teacher's pet," "brainless braggart," and "insufferable clod" to describe Dawson and Chuck. How do you feel when you hear these words? Would you want someone else to say them to you? List some ways you can stop namecalling and help others feel safe and welcome in your community.
- Haley is a model Gravitas trainee who becomes afraid and loses her ability to "press" after an incident with Uncle Saul. That same incident weighs Noah down with guilt. How has a negative emotion held you back or weighed you down?
- Rodney dreaded the time in New York
   City with his dad and often called on his
   friends to bail him out. In the end, the
   father-son duo enjoyed a live jazz jam
   session at a park. Discuss a time when
   you participated in something you were
   not looking forward to that turned out to
   be memorable.




- Noah struggles with feelings of anger in The Minor Rescue. He takes a leaf from the Hulk's book and channels his anger in various situations that affect his body, gravitar training, friendships, and decision-making. Haley encourages him in Chapter 17 to take the time to "think first for once, instead of always running on anger." What kind of anger issues have you experienced? How do you learn to control your emotions?
- Olivia and Dawson help Noah connect the dots to see what he has in common with the kidnapped gravitars: "Each one of the kids on the wall was found lacking by Gravitas. Just like me. We're connected because of it, making me care for them in a way I should have before." Has there been a time when you felt rejected, inadequate, or needed to prove your worth? How did you overcome it?
- "It's a good thing to hope, even when things seem hopeless. And caring is a beautiful thing." Olivia reminds Noah to focus on fighting for all that is true, good, and beautiful, as it will crowd out doubts and fears. What is true, good, and beautiful to you worth fighting for?

- The book ends with the notion that heroes can be ordinary people with super powers. Who are the heroes in your life? What are their super powers?
- The Minor Rescue is the second book in The Amazing Adventures of Noah Minor series. What would you want it to be about if the author and illustrator made a third?


Create a friendship connection comic strip using the guide below. Draw yourself in the center, then illustrate and name people who are connected to you in all the most extraordinary ways!
