Stephen Arterburn is the founder and chairman [of New Life Ministries](#) and host of the # 1 nationally syndicated Christian counseling talk show “New Life Live” and “New Life TV,” available online.

Both broadcasts delve into a variety of problems—marriage, anger, grief, anxiety, abuse, addictions, and other issues, and are heard and watched by millions on over 180 radio stations nationwide in addition to Sirius XM Satellite radio.

He is also the founder of the Women of Faith conferences attended by over 4,000,000 people and serves as a teaching pastor at Heartland Church in Indianapolis, Indiana.

Arterburn is a nationally known public speaker and has been featured in national media venues such as “Oprah,” “Inside Edition,” “Good Morning America,” “CNN Live,” The New York Times, USA Today, US News &

World Report, “ABC World News Tonight,” and ironically in GQ magazine and Rolling Stone magazine. In August 2000, Arterburn was inducted into the National Speakers Association’s Hall of Fame.

He is a best-selling author of books such as the *Every Man’s Battle* series, with *Every Man’s Battle* receiving a 2013 ECPA Platinum Award for selling over 1 million copies; *Lose It for Life*; *Healing Is A Choice*; *More Jesus, Less Religion, Is This the One?*; and *Walking Into Walls*. With over 7 million books in print he has been writing about God’s transformational truth since 1984. He has been nominated for numerous writing awards and won three Gold Medallions for writing excellence. Along with Dave Stoop, he edited and produced The Life Recovery Bible.

He is co-author of ***Worthy of Her Trust*** (WaterBrook Press, August 19, 2014) with Jason B. Martinkus, an “Every Man Battle” workshop leader and counselor at Redemptive Living.

Arterburn has degrees from Baylor University and The University of North Texas as well as two honorary doctorate degrees and is currently completing his doctoral studies in Christian Counseling.

Arterburn resides with his family in McCordsville, Indiana.
